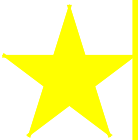

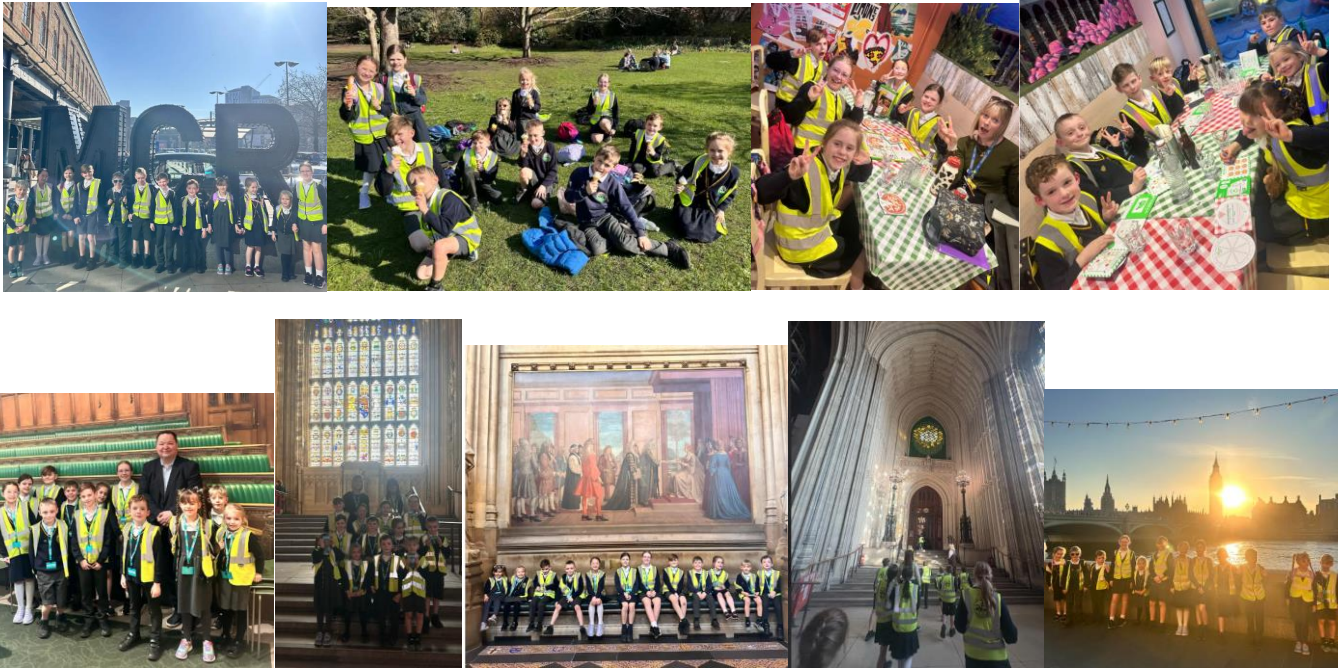
## Talk to the children

## London
