During the first week, back we will open up the booking link for parents evening which will be on 29th April.



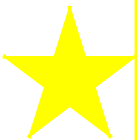
Attendance

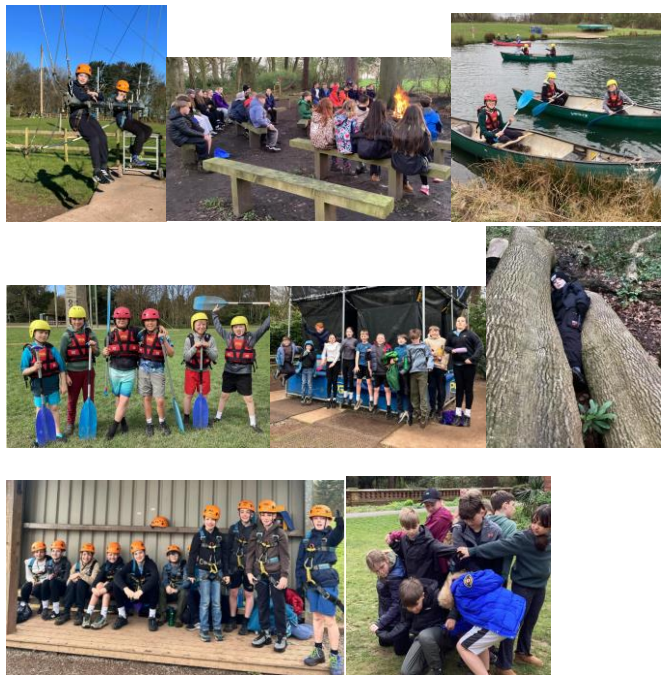
Year 6 Residential
