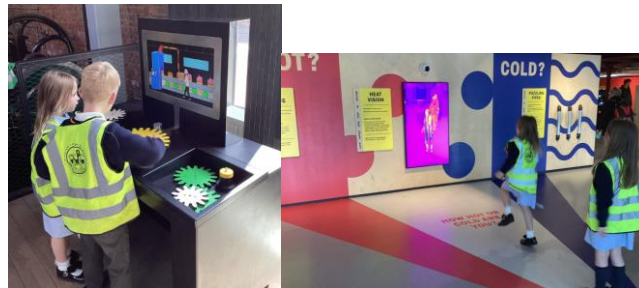
Agents of Change
