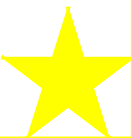
Attendance

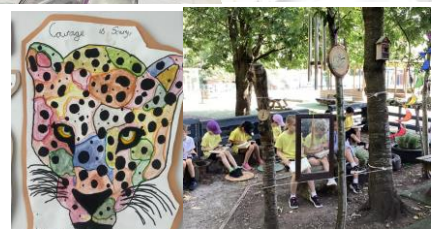
Rounders
